## **AFRIMENTS Hosts Metrology School in Nairobi, Kenya**

The Intra- Africa Metrology System (AFRIMETS) together with the United Nations Industrial development Organization (UNIDO), the Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation (NORAD), Kenya Bureau of Standards (KEBS) and the Measures Department of Kenya, hosted a metrology school at Red Court Hotel, Nairobi, Kenya. A first of its kind, the AFRIMETS Metrology School was held from 7 to 16 February 2011. The school was attended by over 85 participants mainly from African countries following a rigorous selection process. Amongst the participants, were also seven young metrologists from Asia and the Americas in order to facilitate networking and inter regional knowledge exchange.

Metrology School

The AFRIMETS Metrology School was designed to give young metrologists from Africa an introduction to the components of a quality infrastructure and the elements that make up a sound measurement system for a country. Presentations on the various technical aspects were made by 17 international speakers from national and international metrology institutes and supporting organizations. Mrs Maureen P Mutasa, the SADCAS Chief Executive Officer (CEO) presented two papers on accreditation. The program which also involved technical visits provided participants with hands on experience in a number of technical fields.

Metrology is the science and practice of measurement. It is the cornerstone of any quality assurance process. Metrology is strategically important in a country's development. AFRIMETS was established in 2006 with the goal of harmonizing accurate measurements across the continent of Africa, establish new

measurement facilities and gain international acceptance for all measurements critical to export, environmental monitoring and sanitary and phyto-sanitary issues. AFRIMETS mission is to promote metrology in Africa, facilitate intra African and international trade.

## SADCAS Receives Trademark Registration Certificate from ARIPO

The SADCAS trademark which forms the core of the SADCAS accreditation mark has now been registered in Lesotho, Malawi, Namibia, Swaziland, Tanzania and Zimbabwe through the African Regional Intellectual Property Organization (ARIPO). The trademark has been registered in 5 classes 35, 41 42, 44 and 45 following a rigorous process which took almost 2 years. The trademark registration certificate which is valid for 10 years from the date of filing in November 2008 and may be renewed for further periods of ten years each, was handed over to Mrs Maureen P Mutasa the SADCAS CEO by Mr G H Sibanda the Director of ARIPO at a ceremony held on 14 January 2011 in Harare, Zimbabwe. The ceremony was also attended by Messrs M E Appiah and Mulenga both of whom are legal officers with ARIPO.

The SADCAS trademark has already been registered in Botswana, Mauritius, Mozambique, Zambia and Angola with the latter country having issued interim registration certificates. The registration process is still underway in DRC and Seychelles.

# Seychelles Bureau of Standards' Metrology Laboratory Accredited

The Seychelles Bureau of Standards' (SBS) Metrology Laboratory has been accredited in the scope of mass, by SADC Accreditation Service (SADCAS). SBS Metrology Laboratory is the third facility to be accredited by SADCAS and the first facility in Seychelles to be accredited.

Speaking during the certificate handover ceremony held at The Standards House Providence in Mahe, Seychelles on 2 March

2011, Mrs Amy Quatre, Director General SBS outlined the journey towards accreditation which started in 2009 culminating in the Metrology Laboratory being accredited in the scope of mass. Mrs Quatre thanked the European Union, PTB Germany, SADC Cooperation in Metrology and the Ministry of Investment Natural Resources and Industry for their support throughout the process. She also paid tribute to the staff of SBS who had worked tirelessly to make the accreditation dream a reality.

In her congratulatory speech Mrs Maureen P Mutasa the SADCAS CEO explained to dignitaries present that SBS Metrology Laboratory had been accredited in the scope of mass pieces in the range 1 to 100 grams in accordance with ISO/IEC 17025. This accreditation demonstrates SBS Metrology Laboratory's competence in the scope of mass and the operation of a laboratory quality management system, a guarantee for reliable, accurate and traceable calibration results. SADCAS was delighted that SBS Metrology Laboratory was the first facility in Seychelles to be accredited as metrology which is the science and practice of measurement , is the cornerstone of any quality assurance process. Mrs Mutasa encouraged SBS Metrology Laboratory to maintain their accreditation throughout the validity period of 5 years for the accreditation cer-

tificate. She further encouraged SBS Metrology Laboratory to extend the scope of accreditation into the other measurements

Honourable Peter Sinon, the Minister of Investment, Natural Resources and Industry commended SBS for the achievement and for being the first facility in Seychelles to be accredited. He noted that the achievement had come at an opportune time when Seychelles is preparing its bid to accede to the World Trade Organization. He further noted the new European accreditation requirements regarding fish exports. Fish exports together with tourism are the mainstays of Seychelles' economy. He therefore challenged SBS to get its fish testing and inspection services accredited so as to avoid the costly and time consuming, retesting of Seychelles fish exports. The Minister commended SADC for the establishment of SADCAS which provides ready access to cost effective accreditation services and congratulated SBS management and staff for the achievement.

The certificate handover ceremony was attended by members of the diplomatic mission, principal secretaries, chief executive officers, SBS board members and staff and followed by a tour of SBS laboratories.

riday the 18<sup>th</sup> of March 2011 was a momentous day for the Southern African Development Community Accreditation Service (SADCAS) and the Botswana Bureau of Standards (BOBS). The day was marked by a ceremony at which SADCAS handed over the accreditation certificate to the BOBS' Industrial Metrology Unit, the first facility to be accredited by SADCAS. The ceremony was attended by members of the diplomatic missions, senior government officials, business executives, BOBS Council members, SADCAS Board members, BOBS and SADCAS staff members.

The guest of Honour, Honourable Dorcas Makgato-Malesu, the Minister of Trade and Industry, in her address commended BOBS on their achievement. She noted that as the government they were delighted to see some return on their investment in BOBS. She acknowledged that the journey to accreditation was demanding but it was through perseverance that BOBS managed to get the Industrial Metrology Unit accredited.

The Southern African development Community's (SADC) through the SADC SQAM expert Dr Oswald Chinyamakobvu who delivered the SADC Executive Secretary, Dr Salomão's speech remarked that they were celebrating a SADC success story in that SADCAS a subsidiarity organization of SADC had accredited its first three facilities amongst which is the BOBS Industrial Metrology Unit. He further encouraged conformity assessment bodies in Botswana to utilize the SADCAS services.

Mr Ron Josias, the CEO of the South African National Accreditation System (SANAS), expressed his pride in sharing this point in history with SADCAS the first multi-economy accreditation body in the world. SANAS the oldest accreditation body in SADC is working together with SADCAS under a Twinning Partnership Arrangement through which international recognition of the SADCAS accreditation certificate is achieved.

The SADCAS CEO Mrs Maureen P Mutasa congratulated Mr Kajani, the Manager— Laboratory Services (Industrial Metrology) and the BOBS' team on being the first metrology laboratory in Botswana to be accredited. She however reminded them of the annual surveillance visits which will be conducted in order to ensure maintenance of accreditation throughout the five-year period of the certificate

Mrs Masego Marobela, the Managing Director of BOBS thanked all those who had made it possible for BOBS to achieve their accreditation and encouraged other manufacturers, service providers, consumers, BOBS' staff and the public at large heed the Minister's call to effectively take advantage of and leverage on the services provided by BOBS and contribute to the development Botswana's economy.

# SADCAS CEO Meets with Heads of Medical Laboratories in Seychelles

A s part of the SADCAS promotional and marketing plans for 2010/11, the SADCAS CEO Mrs Maureen P Mutasa was in Seychelles from 2 to 4 March 2011. The purpose of the visit to Seychelles was to attend the accreditation certificate handover ceremony of the Seychelles Bureau of Standards' Metrology Laboratory as well as to promote accreditation and to market SADCAS service offerings.

The main conformity assessment bodies in Seychelles are the Seychelles Bureau of Standards and the Ministry of Health. The SBS is responsible for calibration, testing, fish inspection and certification activities. The SBS Metrology laboratory whose accreditation certificate was handed over by the SADCAS CEO on 2 March 2011 is the first facility to be accredited in Seychelles and the third facility to be accredited by SADCAS. The SBS Metrology Laboratory was accredited in the scope of mass. The SBS Environment Laboratory has already been assessed whilst the SBS Inspection Unit and certification Unit are working towards accreditation.

The Ministry of Health is responsible for public health and testing of food, water, clinical and pharmaceutical samples. The SAD-CAS CEO met with four representatives of three medical laboratories on 3 March 2011. The meeting was held at the Ministry of Health's Offices in Mahe, Seychelles.

The meeting was attended by Mr Philip Palmore, Public Health Laboratory, Mr Prosper Kinabo, Clinical Laboratory, Dr Albert Hoho, Clinical Laboratory, Ms Lucile de Comarmond, Director Pharmaceutical Services and Ms Dhana Sasikumar, Quality Control Manager Drug Control Laboratory. The SADCAS CEO was accompanied to the meeting by Mrs Nair the SADCA Committee member for Seychelles. SADCAS was briefed on the accreditation status of each of the laboratories and challenges faced. None of the laboratories are accredited but all the laboratories are aware of the need for accreditation and two of the laboratories are already working towards accreditations. In turn the SADCAS CEO updated the delegates on developments in SADCAS and responded to the various accreditation issues raised during the briefings and in particular explained the why a laboratory should go for accreditation in accordance with ISO/IEC 17025 or ISO 15189 as relevant and not ISO 9001 certification noting that one of the laboratories represented had been certified to ISO 9001. Mrs Mutasa also outlined the accreditation process in response to a question raised by all the representatives on where to start emphasizing the need for awareness training and specialized training on the relevant accreditation standard. She also talked about Proficiency Testing issues, the need for accredited calibration services for traceability of measurements. In response to the question on accreditation costs Mrs Mutasa outlined the SADCAS cost structure highlighting how SADCAS was ensuring the competitiveness of its accreditation rates. Mrs Nair shared with participants SBS experiences in accreditation. Mrs Mutasa suggested the establishment of a laboratory network so as to share experienced in accreditation matters.

The targeted visit to Seychelles was very successful. The meeting with medical laboratories representatives was worthwhile as it cleared some myths on accreditation resulting with expressed interest in SADCAS training services for which duly completed training request forms are awaited.

## March 2011 IAF Technical Committee Meetings

s Jeanne Françoise Ranorovelo, the SADCAS Technical Manager attended the International Accreditation Forum (IAF) Technical Committee (TC) meetings held at the Conference Centre, Epson Downs Racecourse in Surrey, England from 5 to 11 March 2011. The meetings were attended by representatives of accreditation and certification bodies and industries from Australia, Botswana, Brazil, Canada, China, Korea, France, Germany, Great Britain, India, Japan, Norway, Russia, South Africa, Taiwan, Thailand, USA, and from ISO/CASCO in Geneva. Ms Ranorovelo represented SADCAS at the meetings which were relocated at very short notice from Tunis, Tunisia to Surrey, England, UK. The meetings were organized by Mr Roger Bennett who is the representative of the Independent Organization for Certification (IIOC) and also IAF Board of Director for Conformity Assessment Body Association Members.

The Surrey meetings focused on certification issues. The main discussions were on the competence of assessors involved in the accreditation services. Regarding competence of assessors, the results of the survey conducted from April to August 2010 were presented and a final document related to training needs, assessment criteria and evaluation checklist to measure the assessors' competence were discussed and will be issued. The meetings also discussed the amendment of some IAF/ILAC documents where the competence of assessors needs to be included, cross frontier policy, management of crises, product certification, certification of personnel, food safety management systems, market surveillance, forest certification, auditors,' competence, medical devices, greenhouse gas management and the Multilateral Recognition Arrangement.

## SADCA Executive Committee Meets in Pretoria, South Africa

he SADC Cooperation in Accreditation's Executive Committee (SADCA ExCo) held its 6<sup>th</sup> meeting on 18 February 2011 at Elegant Lodge in Pretoria, South Africa. The meeting was attended by Mrs Masego B Marobela, the SADCA ExCo Chairman, Mr Ron Josias, the SADCA Regional Coordinator, Mr Riundja Ali Kaakunga (Othy) (Member), Mrs Maureen P Mutasa (Member), Ms Kuena Molapo, SADCA SQAM Expert who attended in place of Dr Oswald Chinyamakobvu (Member) and Ms Nonhlanhla Halimana, SADCA Secretary.

During the one day meeting, the SADCA ExCo reviewed the short term mission report on the performance of a needs assessment survey on proficiency testing schemes in SADC member states undertaken by Dr Mukayi T Musarurwa as part of the SADC/EU SQAM project. The report provides some useful insights into the status, operations, challenges and needs in the area of PT services in the region. The SADC region like other developing regions worldwide faces many challenges on availability of information on PT schemes and accessibility to PT schemes. Participation in PT /Inter-laboratory Comparisons (ILCs) is a requirement of ISO/IEC 17025. It is therefore imperative that the region through its SQAM structures facilitates information dissemination and capacity development in this essential component of any laboratory management system. Noting the importance of the subject matter and insights provided on PT issues in the report, the SADCA ExCo agreed to request the SADC Secretariat to have the report formally considered by other interested SADC SQAM structures for a consolidated view on the conclusion and recommendation of the report and to determine the way forward with regards to the issues raised in the report. In the meantime, SADCA will endeavour to, subject to availability of funds, participate at the upcoming workshop on ISO/IEC

17043 to be held in Montreux, Switzerland in April 2011. The workshop is designed to share experiences on the implementation of the recently published ISO/IEC 17043. SADCA will also explore the hosting of a regional training workshop on the new standard ISO/IEC 17043.

As part of the SADCA Business Plan development process, the SADCA ExCo, at its previous meeting held on 17 November 2010, reviewed the SADCA By laws and relevant parts of the TBT Annex to the SADC Protocol on Trade. The reviews of these documents were finalized at the February 2011 meeting. A draft of the revised SADCA By Laws and the proposed amendments to the TBT Annex to the SADC Protocol on Trade will be presented at the upcoming SADCA General Assembly meeting. The SADCA ExCo further finalized the programme for the development process of the Business Plan. According to the programme, a series of strategic planning sessions/consultations will be held during the year culminating with the presentation of the Business Plan at the 2012 SADCA Annual General Meeting.

A considerable part of the day's meeting was spent on preparing for the 2011 SADCA Annual General Meeting during which the ExCo reviewed the SADCA annual report and finalized the agenda for the annual meeting which will be held on Thursday, 24 March 2011 in Gaborone, Botswana in conjunction with other SQAM meetings.

The SADCA ExCo was appointed in 2009 following the disbandment of the SADCA Project Management Committee. The SADC ExCo is responsible the effective pursuit of SADCA's objectives and for the day to day management of SADCA.

## **NAFP-Botswana Pays Courtesy Visits to Laboratories**

n an effort to promote and market accreditation and SADCAS, NAFP- Botswana officers Messrs Goitseone Seitshiro and Edward Mmatli paid courtesy visits to the National food control laboratory, Lamworld Technology and the Department of Water Affairs.

The National Food Control Laboratory is located in Gaborone under the Ministry of Health and is mandated to monitor food and drinking water quality throughout Botswana. The laboratory carries out routine analyses for nutrient (*e.g.*, fat, carbohydrate, vitamins, proteins, metals and anions) and microbiological content in both food and water. The laboratory which is made up of a chemical and microbiology sections is headed by Principal Scientific Officer I, Mrs AF Kashani. The laboratory also tests food under the following circumstances:

- All the food acquired for Botswana Government under the government feeding programme
- Food in the local market in conjunction with environmental officers/ health inspectors from various district councils
- All consumer complaints (relating to foodstuff) in conjunction with Department of Consumer protection.
- Emergencies, e.g., in case of food poisoning and water borne disease outbreaks.

The National Food control laboratory is working towards accreditation and has already had its staff trained on ISO/IEC 17025. Development of the Quality manual is underway and the laboratory is already participating in Inter laboratory comparisons coordinated by the Botswana Bureau of Standards. Because the laboratory is not yet accredited samples are sent outside the country for confirmation which is costly to the government. Accreditation is therefore high on the National laboratories agenda.

Lamworld Technologies is a private calibration laboratory with clientele from various sectors of the economy (such as companies in mining industry, hospitals, police, etc) within and outside Botswana. Lamworld Technologies which has two (2) facilities in Gaborone offers calibration services for pressure, mass, torque and volume, electrical ACDC and low frequency and radio frequency (RF) and temperature, and repairs of equipment that fails calibration. It has over 70 customers from all over the country in diverse fields such as mining, health-hospitals, police, civil engineering firms involved in the construction of roads and buildings, consultants and manufacturing. The Laboratory boasts of an online complete solution calibration system that automates the entire calibration system made by INDYSOFT. The system contains the entire list of clients and their equipment and makes a reservation for a particular calibration of the equipment, makes quotations as well as sends reminders for the equipment due for calibration among others. The advantage of this system is that it can serve as an asset management tool of clients. Lamworld Technologies has already submitted an application for accreditation to the ISO/IEC 17025 and aims to be accredited before the end of the year. As a part of company introspection, Lamworld Technologies undertake internal audits and have been audited by their various clients such as Air Botswana, Civil Aviation Authority and Ministry of Transport among others as part of tender requirements.

The Department of Water Affairs Laboratory carries out water analysis including waste water analysis. The Laboratory handles samples from villages and councils from all over the country. However the number of samples is declining since some of the activities e.g. water supply which used to be carried out by the Department of Water Affairs have been transferred to Water Utilities Corporation. The Laboratory mainly undertakes routine analysis for physical parameters in water, i.e. pH, conductivity, trace metals and anions. The Laboratory is working towards accreditation and has already had its staff trained and has benefited from the SADC EU SQAM project through which a consultant was assigned to assist the laboratory in its journey towards accreditation. The main challenges encountered by the Laboratory are the failure to validate most of their procedures due to lack of suitable certified reference materials (CRM). The laboratory has only so far validated 6 out of their 23 test procedures. The Laboratory participates in Inter Laboratory Comparisons and Proficiency Testing Schemes.

Generally all the laboratories appreciated the visits and see the need to have their facilities accredited. The main challenges faced by the laboratories are related to availability of resources for accreditation activities a matter which is being pursued with the laboratories' respective management.



The Award is open to NAFPs who have served as an NAFP for at least two years, regularly submit and timeously submit quarterly reports on activities undertaken, have effectively progressed the implementation of their respective country's action plan on accreditation and contributed towards SADCAS goals. The 2011 Award is based on the reports for the period 1 January up to 31 December 2010. NAFP- Zimbabwe was established in 2005 with the appointment of the now late Mr Francis Karani who was subsequently replaced in 2008 by Mr Christopher Ngwenya as the first officer and Mrs Mildred Machiri as the second officer. The NAFP has made very good progress during the period under review. The activities included awareness raising workshops and meetings with stakeholders and governments, counseling visits to potential clients, production of own NAFP promotional materials, distribution of SADCAS promo-

# Zimbabwe Embraces Accreditation as a Strategy for the Competence of Medical Laboratories

The credibility and efficient operation of a medical laboratory is paramount to any health delivery system. Realizing the importance of laboratory services as an integral part of the health delivery system, the Zimbabwe Government through the Ministry of Health and Child Welfare, launched a Health Laboratory Policy covering the period 2010 to 2014. The policy embraces accreditation as a strategy for the competence and efficient operation of medical laboratories' quality system at all levels in Zimbabwe.

In order to strengthen the implementation of medical laboratories' quality system, the Zimbabwe National Quality Assurance Program (ZINQAP) hosted a 5 days' ISO 15189 training course for medical laboratories in Zimbabwe. A total of 25 health professionals from various medical laboratories attended the course which was held from 13 to 17 December 2010 at the Rainbow Towers in Harare. The course was delivered by a SADCAS trainer.

The objectives of the 5 days course were to promote a thorough understanding of ISO 15189 standard requirements and to impart internal auditing knowledge and skills to medical laboratories staff so as to monitor compliance with the standard. The course covered an overview of accreditation, the ISO 15189 requirements i.e. management and technical requirements, internal auditing tools, techniques and the process as well as validation methods and procedures. The intensive and practical course was very well received by participants who at the end of the course were motivated to go and implement the standard in their respective organizations.

ZINQAP is a non- profit organization whose mandate is to provide accredited proficiency testing services and continuous professional development program for medical laboratory experts so as to attain and maintain a high level of quality testing. ZINQAP is a SANAS accredited proficiency service provider.

# SADCAS Holds its First ISO/IEC 17020 Training Course for Inspection Bodies

SADCAS successfully held a 5-day ISO/IEC 17020 course for inspection bodies in Zimbabwe. The course which was attended by 15 participants from 6 inspection bodies was held from 29 November to 3 December 2010 at the Rainbow Towers in Harare.

Inspection bodies need to ensure that they have the people, facilities, technical expertise and management systems in order to undertake inspections professionally and competently thus deliver accurate and reliable inspection results to their clients. Accreditation which is the process of providing recognition to a conformity assessment body for its competence in performing specific tasks is the strategy for achieving this. For inspection bodies concerned with demonstrating competence underpinned by a quality system, the appropriate international standard is ISO/IEC 17020 which specifies general criteria for the competence of impartial inspection bodies irrespective of the sector involved. In order to have confidence in the data generated by inspection bodies

operating in Zimbabwe the National Social Security Authority (NSSA) now requires all inspection bodies to be accredited in order to be registered as an inspection authority.

The objectives of the 5 days course were to promote a thorough understanding of ISO/IEC 17020 standard requirements and to impart internal auditing knowledge and skills to inspection bodies staff so as to monitor compliance with the standard. The exercises were a source of invaluable practical experience and information on the development, implementation, maintenance and improvement of a quality management system that meets ISO/IEC 17020 requirements.
